HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS

NEVER shop alone

DO NOT flash your cash

Keep your cash/credit cards in your front pocket

DO NOT put gifts in your car and go back shopping – this is an invitation for thieves.

- DO NOT put a whole computer or TV box in the trash. Break the box down. A computer or TV box in the trash is an invitation for a thief to break in your home and get your NEW computer or TV
- Be courteous to your Holiday visitors or even the mailman and SHOVEL YOUR SIDEWALKS (even after the holidays)
- ALWAYS call 911 in case of an emergency

CURFEW

Curfew hours for children 15, 16 and 17 years of age. It is unlawful for a child 15, 16 or 17 years of age to be in a public place in the city at any time during the following curfew hours.

(1) Between 12:00am and 5:00am on Saturday or Sunday

(2) Between 10:00pm and 5:00am on Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday Curfew hours for children younger than 15 years of age. It is unlawful for a child younger than 15 Years of age to be in a public place in the city after 10:00pm or before 5:00am on any day
